THE HOSPITAL AND THE FOUNDATION

Necha Community Hospital is established in 2008 with the support of the Asian Heritage Foundation (AHF) Nepal. The objective of the hospital is to improve the health status of families through providing access to basic health services and raising awareness on general health risks. AHF Nepal agreed to support the hospital for the next 7 years by employing a doctor, building partnerships with medical institutions, facilitating fundraising activities and developing management structures. *[Left picture: children from Necha]*

WHY NECHA

Necha village is located on the foothills of the Mt. Everest and regarded as one of the most isolated areas in Nepal. There aren't any roads going to Necha and before the hospital was established 50,000 people living in and around Necha had to walk more than 1 day to reach a health centre. Most families in Necha are living from the land and earn a livelihood with hard manual labor. Deprivation from basic health care has a strong impact on their survival. *[Right picture: man carrying a patient to the hospital]*



HOSPITAL SERVICES

Since 2010 Doctor Robin and his medical staff are providing the following services:

- Basic consultation and pharmacy
- First aid at emergency
- Maternity care and deliveries
- Referrals to specialized hospitals

In addition the doctor is advising the patients on preventive health and hygiene.
